The GVE newsletter is appreciated by those who read it. Those who don't bother are the ones who come occasionally to a monthly meeting only to complain about a personal issue. It is a poor reflection on our population. If you are observant enough to notice the amount of new building going on around us, you know that green-space in these new neighborhoods is nearly non-existent. It is carefully planned around "lakes" which are required holding ponds. Every possible square foot is built on with as much density as the law will allow. In contrast, GVE has beautiful lawns surrounding every home; trees and flowering shrubs planted, not to hide the unsightly, but to enhance the surroundings.

Back Flow Preventers

Many GVE residents received a letter from the Sarasota County Public Utilities Department regarding backflow preventer operational testing. If you do not have either a well or irrigation system you do not need this test and you should check with the County. For the rest of us, it is a requirement. After speaking to several of the listed companies GVE made an arrangement with Mack Renick Plumbing Inc., located at 620 Bayshore Road, Nokomis, phone 941-223-0655. If you contact this company directly and tell them you live in Gulf View Estates they will arrange the testing and paperwork for a cost of \$35. This will include the cost of minor repairs, if necessary, but not a total replacement.
